As a proud 1982 graduate of Assumption, and someone who has been involved with the University for so many years, this is a particularly nice gift for me. I want to start by extending my heartfelt congratulations to all of you for this special accomplishment. Whether you are in the

Business Program or the Helping Professions
Program, achieving your graduate degree is
an accomplishment that is nothing short of
impressive. And something I know you ALL
worked VERY hard for! You are now in the
rarified air of less than 14% of the U.S.
population to have dedicated the time, energy
and sacrifice to obtain this advanced degree.

A huge thanks and congratulations also go out to your amazing family, friends, and support group. As they say, behind every great person is a "village". No one gets there alone! And finally, a special thanks to our faculty and administration.

all the great opportunities in front of us in this country and world.

To thrive in our dynamic world, we need leaders who can navigate through uncertainty, be flexible, think smart and provide value. YOU ARE THOSE LEADERS! So, my message to you today is do not hesitate and have no fear to lead! In fact, **EMBRACE** it! Seize the leadership moments you'll encounter. Lead by example, stand out and make an impact. As an Assumption graduate, you are ready to think and act like a leader. Most importantly the world needs your skills and YOU to lead!

Start by lifting others up and helping others do their best! None of us in this world get things done alone. The best experiences I have had included being part of high performing and winning teams. Teams and great people need a great leader to get the best out of them. Being a great leader, coach, mentor, or educator MATTERS! It matters to the people you are privileged to lead, and it helps them excel and get to the next level.

I was fortunate to have had so many mentors and leaders in my career who empowered me, guided me, inspired me, AND challenged

(usually long before I was "really" ready),
pushed me to learn new things, put me into
many uncomfortable assignments that
stretched me,

and always had me, as one manager said,
"barely able to breath and, barely able to see
over the bow of the boat". Most importantly
they believed in me and my capabilities....

often even beyond what I thought I could do.

Be the leader that lifts others up!

Second, push the boundaries!!! Don't settle for mediocracy or complacency, or just simply keeping things "the same". Nothing in this

world changes without inspirational leaders
who have the courage to THINK BIG, push
boundaries and who also have the courage
and endurance to lead in the face of often
tough obstacles and critics.

When I started at Fidelity Investments in the late 90's, we were still a relatively small firm. Every day felt like we were innovating and pushing the boundaries of technology, improving things for our customers and growing businesses. It was energizing, AND absolutely a blast! When I left a couple years ago, the revenue had exploded, and we had grown to over 70,000 employees. I was proud

to be part of a culture of big ideas that drove such explosive growth and doing such good things to help improve people's financial lives.

Another great example is the current disruption in the mental health space where we're seeing many companies launching hybrid or fully online mental health counseling and therapy sites. This innovative idea has paved the way to reach and help far more people than we could have ever imagined.

Third, celebrate the wins, and push through and persevere through the losses or down times. The reality is that there are times you will succeed greatly and times you just won't. Like any sports team, you just don't always win. You must learn from your failures, pick yourself up, and keep going! My career often felt like the stock market with lots of ups and downs and gyrations. But, like the market, over time, with hard work, it did go up. In Roosevelt's Man in the Arena speech, he said I will paraphrase...

It is not the critic who counts... The credit
belongs to the man who is actually in the
arena; who strives valiantly; who at the best
knows in the end the triumph of high
achievement, and who at the worst, if he
fails, at least fails while daring greatly, so
that his place shall never be with those cold
and timid souls who neither know victory nor
defeat."

So, I encourage all of you to get in the arena!

You're all going into such noble professions,

and I know you will make them count!

I wish you the best in all your future endeavors and my hope is you come back to

share your well-earned wisdom and experiences with other Assumption students in the future.
